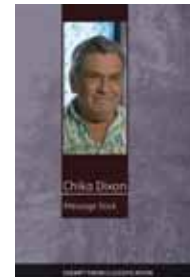

In 1945, the Carrolup School of the south west of Western Australia was flourishing. A messianic school teacher, Noel White, had appeared and through his open minded attitude, he nurtured the gifts and talents of the school children. Their pupils confidence in their amazing gifts grew - the doodles became landscapes of the surrounding countryside - then as they wanted more time to develop their painting techniques the children asked if they could have evening lessons.

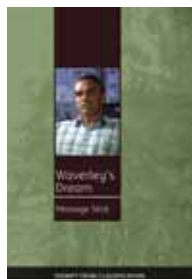

From the early 1800's Aboriginal people have been used as guides and trackers by the police force. One of the most highly regarded trackers was Sergeant Alexander Riley of Dubbo, NSW. In 1943 Alexander Riley was awarded the highest police award - the King's Medal for distinguished services. During Tracker Riley's time with the NSW Police Force 1911 - 1950, he was instrumental in solving over seven murder cases and finding numerous people lost in the bush.

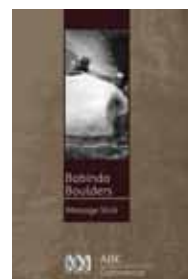

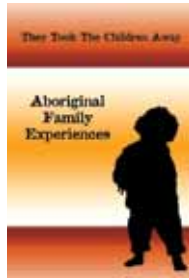

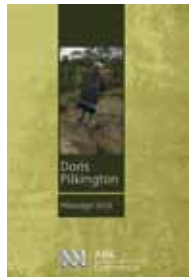

This program shows how to really survive the perils of the Australian bush.
